http://kpslearnathome.weebly.com/ and clicking on "6th Grade." From there, students can work on each subject's/content's lessons and assignments by scrolling down to find the subject/content they want to focus on and then the week it currently is. So, for this week, focus on work for "Week 6."

In the rest of this newsletter, you will find information from your individual teachers that you need to know for this week's learning opportunities. Please read through the entire newsletter and contact your homeroom teacher or a specific content area teacher with any questions.

#### ELA-

This is it! This is your final week! Please go to our Google Classroom to access individual copies of the assignments for this week that you can complete and submit. If you can't get to Google Classroom, then you can access the same documents on the Learn at Home page, but you will have to make copies of the documents in order to complete the assignments.

Here is a quick rundown of what you have for ELA:

- LXL: Complete 2-3 lessons that include P.1, P.4, R.1, R.2
- □ Read "Drum Dream Girl" and complete the short answer questions with it.
- **Q** Read "Harlem" and complete the short answer questions with it.
- Complete the Final Written Response. Be thorough in your response.

All of these can be submitted in Google Classroom. If you can't submit them in Google Classroom, then you can share your document with me. Do not turn in blank documents.

Miss you all! Keep up the hard work! I am proud of you for being teachable, empowered, accepting, and motivated! It's the last week so finish strong!

**MATH-** There is no math worksheet to turn in! Go to the math page, look at math examples, watch the videos, look at practice problems and when you have a good grasp of the topic attempt the worksheet. You will show your level of understanding by clicking on the "check in" button and practicing the IXL objectives listed each week. I will be able to see your progress or questions you may need answered. That is how you "turn in" an assignment so that I can count your at home learning. Feel free to contact me by email with any questions, I miss you all.

**SCIENCE:** Woot! Final week!! On the science page, there are four boxes. You pick <u>at least one box to complete.</u> If you feel good about the topic, you may move on to the listed IXL assignment(s). If you need extra background, do additional activities. <u>IXL is due no later</u> than 11 am Friday this week, please. That is the assignment that you are "turning in" to me. Pay attention to what grade level is mentioned for IXL...it won't always be 6th grade! A lot of students do the wrong IXL assignment!! (The assigned IXL topics are listed under recommendations with a star next to them.) *NOTE: There is a link on the assignment page to sign up for a free BRAINPOP account...use the Family Access option.*

<ul> <li>Read ONLY Section 3 in Chapter 6 - answer questions as needed to help you</li> </ul>	I'd really like to see a picture!


## **SOCIAL STUDIES**
